## FROM WHERE I SIT . . .

My dictionary defines an organist as 'a person who plays the organ'. Basically this is true, but in reality the function of an organist in a UR Church is not that simple. My description would take rather more than six words. The primary function is surely to lead and encourage the congregation in the singing of hymns. Here at Reigate Park we are fortunate to have an active choir who can and do make their mark in leading worship in the singing of hymns, and a congregation that responds to this. Unfortunately many of our churches no longer have a choir or an organist (or a minister?); and if you consider the average age of our choir members you may appreciate my concern if I say 'how much longer will there be a choir at Reigate Park?'. When I mention this in conversation the usual reply is 'Oh, we must have a choir'. Yes, we must - but where are the members coming from?

Since the age of twelve I have been an organist; firstly at Crawley Congregational Church (later to become Trinity URC in Ifield) for 44 years, and then here at Reigate Park for just over 19 years. At a conservative estimate I have probably played for about 4000 services and about 20,000 hymns, plus of course numerous anthems and voluntaries.

Why do I do it? I enjoy it immensely (most of the time!) and because it is a way in which I can use whatever musical talents I have to praise the Lord, and to encourage others to use music, in all its forms, in worship. The music played before the service (particularly after the Bible is brought in) should be a time for the congregation to prepare themselves for the worship that will shortly commence. Sadly this does not always happen here. I do sometimes wonder why I am playing when I cannot even hear myself for the noise of

conversation. Perhaps I should be thankful that we have such a large congregation that inevitably makes a lot of noise.

Only on very few occasions do I choose the hymns. They are normally chosen by the minister, who will sometimes request a particular tune. Choice of tune is usually left to me. You may blame me if I play the wrong tune, play too loud, too quiet, too fast, too slow or even if you don't know a hymn or its tune; but what I try to bring to the hymn singing is variety in the way individual verses are sung by means of different stop registration, verses for ladies or men only, an occasional verse for choir only, and even an unaccompanied verse.

It can sometimes be lonely where I sit, but always enjoyable. I can only hope that you enjoy singing the hymns as much as I enjoy accompanying them.

## ECOTIP RECYCLING UPDATE

Some good news! You may remember last year an Ecotip in the Record with a pro-forma to send to Reigate and Banstead Borough Council asking for Tetrapak recycling facilities? Well, someone was listening! We now have Tetrapak recycling facilities at Earlswood Recycling Centre on the A23 with more sites around the Borough to follow.

The Earlswood site has been recently revamped with increased car parking spaces and an improved system to reduce queues on the A23. Other recycling facilities on site include 'Bric-a-brac', old cooking oil, spectacles, coins, plastic bottle tops and bras (I kid you not!). Your very own RPC recycling sleuth uncovered that the bras are collected in aid of Breast Cancer Research.

All of this information and more is contained in the Surrey Household Waste Guide which I try to keep spare copies of at church - do ask me if you would like a personal copy. Virtually the only thing that can't be recycled now in our Borough is plastic pots such as margarine/ice-cream tubs and yogurt pots, and apparently the Borough is working hard to find a company to recycle them. Incidentally, most plastic film can now be recycled with carrier bags at places like Sainsburys. Along with composting food waste in compost bins and green cones, it is possible to have very little each week in the wheelie bin. No one is going to want to invite me for a cuppa anymore for fear that I might check their bins!

You will have heard in the news recently about the stockpiles of recycled material currently accumulating in the UK and some of you have been asking me what is the point in doing any of the above - do keep going - there will be more on that topic in next month's Ecotip....

Derek (b. 1979) is an extraordinarily talented pianist, despite being blind and having severe learning difficulties. He plays entirely by ear, and has a repertoire of many thousands of pieces that he has memorised - jazz, pop and light classical - and he is a great improviser. Derek has played in venues across the UK, including Ronnie Scott's and the Barbican Halls in London, in Europe and the U.S. and he has appeared in the news media across the world.

## **THE SITUATION IN GAZA**

*The message below is from Rev. John Marsh, Moderator of General Assembly.*

There are lots of voices rightly condemning the present situation in Gaza. We cannot imagine how people can endure conditions like those we are witnessing on our television screens. Yet we also need to look further ahead and keep hold of a longer, deeper focus.

Three major world religions regard Israel/Palestine as a 'holy land'. Jews, Christians and Moslems cannot understand their spiritual traditions without some appreciation of the long history that has unfolded in Palestine/Israel and the wider region.

The deeper theological perspectives of the three faiths include the wisdom that all people have their place in God's purposes, and that people of each faith have a fundamental responsibility to safeguard the common interest. Muslims, Christians and Jews are all people of a robust peace that is rooted in God's unconditional love for us all. This is where hope and future lie.

It is not right that the rich spirituality of our traditions is corrupted into hatred and violence, demeaned into a narrow stridency seeking political or military advantage for one interest - at the cost of the well-being of others or of the common good.

It is scandalous that the wise traditions of our historic faiths should be subverted by powerful secular interests to justify defending any one community at any price. Such manipulation can never be for the common good or the wider peace. Political and military power, disconnected from the lively spiritual God-centred peace at the heart of the three religions, offers no prospect of healing or justice for anyone.

Yet our three faiths are also the means by which these precious gifts may be offered to Palestine/Israel - and to the wider world. If Islam, Judaism and Christianity fail in this, our faiths will be roundly condemned and rightly consigned to the dustbin of history.

## **THE SCALLOP SHELL - A SYMBOL OF PILGRIMAGE**

The scallop shell is a traditional symbol of Christian pilgrimage, and is especially associated with the pilgrimage to the burial place of the Apostle James at Santiago de Compostela in north-west Spain.

Everybody present for the final day of the General Assembly of the United Reformed Church in Edinburgh in July 2008 received a gift of a scallop shell with an encouragement to continue personal Christian pilgrimage in fellowship with the whole church.

Scallop shells are often found with baptismal fonts, for scooping water in the administration of the sacrament - a reminder that baptism, our point of entry into the Christian faith and Church, is also the starting point of our pilgrimage of life towards its final destination in God's Realm, through Christ.

The Moderator of the general Assembly chose the theme 'Pilgrimage' for his address to General Assembly and for his two years in office. He now presents this scallop shell to the Musicians' Guild of the United Reformed Church to celebrate the musical journey we make together as God's people.

In addition to those mentioned above, our weekly activities normally include Junior Church and Crèche at 10.00 a.m. each Sunday, Brownies, Beavers, Cubs, Scouts, Busy Bees Playclub, Monday Morning Group, Choir, Conquest Art, Playgroup, Toddlers Plus Group and Short Mat Bowling.
