Communication

The leaders should communicate a relevant Christian message and should communicate with each other regarding themes and relevant issues. Leaders and helpers should arrive in plenty of time to make the room look inviting. After each session an evaluation should be made, and the room should be cleared.



Ensure groupings are relevant.

Attend the termly co-ordinators' meeting to gather all necessary information to pass on to the groups.

Be available for all groups and individuals to discuss areas of concern.

Care

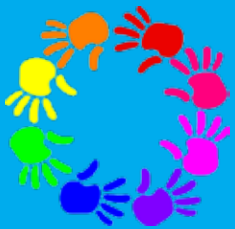

Training

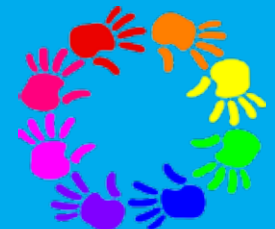
Basic RPC training should be taken. Individuals should try to be involved in as many areas of training as they feel to be advantageous.

Charter for Children in the Church
